



Question (I): In the following multiple choice questions, please choose the correct answer, you must write down the steps to get the correct answer. (25 Marks)

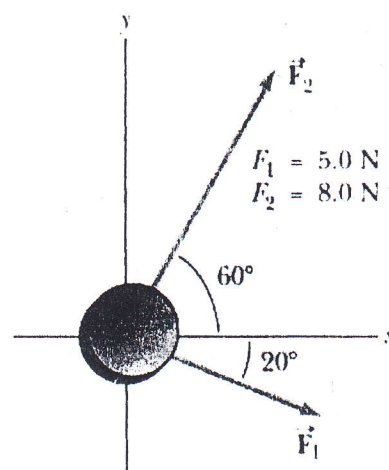
- (1) During a short interval of time, the speed v in m/s of an automobile is given by $v=at^2+bt^3$, where the time t is in seconds. The units of a and b are respectively:
a. m/s^4 ; m/s^5 b. m/s^3 ; m/s^4 c. m/s^2 ; m/s^3 d. s^3/m ; s^4/m
- (2) The side of an iron cube is 6×10^{-6} cm long. If the density is 7.86 g/cm^3 , the mass of the cube, in **SI units**, is approximately:
a. 2.75×10^{-20} b. 1.7×10^{-18} c. 3.64×10^{-18} d. 3.64×10^{19}
- (3) At what temperature is the Celsius scale reading equal to twice the Fahrenheit scale reading?
a. -12.3°F b. -24.6°F c. -12.3°C d. -24.6°C
- (4) A 0.05 kg ingot of metal is heated to 200°C and then dropped into a calorimeter containing 0.4 kg of water initially at 20°C . If the final equilibrium temperature of the mixed system is 22.4°C , the specific heat of the metal is ($S_{\text{water}}=4187 \text{ J/Kg}\cdot^\circ\text{C}$):
a. $150 \text{ J/Kg}\cdot^\circ\text{C}$ b. $453 \text{ J/Kg}\cdot^\circ\text{C}$ c. $673 \text{ J/Kg}\cdot^\circ\text{C}$ d. $800 \text{ J/Kg}\cdot^\circ\text{C}$
- (5) A constant-volume gas thermometer is used to measure the temperature of an object. When it is in contact with the object the pressure is $9.65 \times 10^4 \text{ Pa}$. The temperature of the object is:

- (6) Suppose that $X=YZ$, where X has the dimension L/M and Z has the dimension L/T , then Y has the dimension:

- (7) The Cartesian coordinates of a point in the xy plane are $(x, y) = (-3.5, -2.5) \text{ m}$, the polar coordinates of this point (r, θ) are:

- (9) A house is built of bricks ($k = 0.15 \text{ cal}/(\text{sec. m}\cdot^\circ\text{C})$), with walls 20 cm thick. A wall in one of the rooms of this house measures $5 \text{ m} \times 3 \text{ m}$. What is the heat flow through this wall if the inside temperature is (21°C) and the outside temperature (-18°C)?

- (10) A jet lands on an aircraft carrier at 63 m/s , what is its acceleration (assumed constant) if it stops in 2 s due to an arresting cable that snags the jet and brings it to a stop?

Question (II): Answer the following problems

(25 Marks)

1. A solid cube of Al (density 2.7 g/cm^3) has a volume of 0.2 cm^3 . If the atomic mass of Al is 27 g/mol , how many Al atoms are contained in the cube? [$N_A = 6.02 \times 10^{23}$ atoms/mol]
2. Suppose we are told that the acceleration (a) of a particle moving with uniform speed (v) in a circle of radius (r) is proportional to some power of r , say r^n , and some power of v , say v^m . Determine the values of n and m ? [Use dimension analysis method]
3. An aluminum-alloy rod has a length of 10 cm at 20°C and a length of 10.015 cm at the boiling point of water.
 - a) What is the length of the rod at the freezing point of water?
 - b) What is the temperature if the length of the rod is 10.009 cm ?
4. A long jumper leaves the ground at an angle of 20° above the horizontal and at a speed of 11 m/s [$g = 9.8 \text{ m/s}^2$].
 - a) How far does he jump in the horizontal direction?
 - b) What is the maximum height reached?

5. A hockey puck having a mass of 0.3 kg slides on the horizontal, frictionless surface of an ice rink. Two hockey sticks strike the puck simultaneously, exerting the forces on the puck shown in Figure. The force \vec{F}_1 has a magnitude of 5 N , and the force \vec{F}_2 has a magnitude of 8 N . Determine both the magnitude and the direction of the puck's acceleration.

- 1) A long conductor, straight metal rod has a radius of 5 cm and a charge per unit length of 30 nC/m. Find the electric field (a) 3 cm, (b) 10 cm, and (c) 100 cm from the axis of the rod, where distances are measured perpendicular to the rod's axis. ($k_e = 9 \times 10^9 \text{ N.m}^2/\text{C}^2$)

2) A charge $+q$ is at the origin. A charge $-2q$ is at $x = 2$ m on the x -axis. For what finite value(s) of x is (a) the electric field zero? (b) The electric potential zero?

3) Two capacitors ($C_1 = 5 \mu\text{F}$ and $C_2 = 12 \mu\text{F}$), are connected with a battery of 9 V. Find:

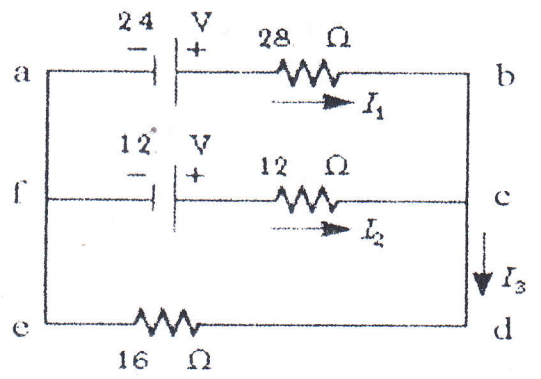
(a) The equivalent capacitance of the combination.

(b) The potential difference across each capacitor.

(c) The charge stored on each capacitor.

In case of the two capacitors are connected in parallel and in series with the battery.

4) Using Kirchhoff's rules, find the current in each resistor in the figure.



- 5) As shown in the figure, the cube is 40 cm on each edge. Four straight segments of wire named as: ab , bc , cd and da form a closed loop that carries a current $I = 5$ A, in the direction shown. A uniform magnetic field of magnitude $B = 0.02$ T is in the positive y direction. Determine the magnitude and direction of the magnetic force on each segment.
